Everything worked fine. then I started doing the recommended changes to system services.....no disabling of any of them, just setting them to manual. I did two to three at a time, thinking I could always go back and set them back to the defaults once I hit the wall......wrong!!!! </div>

<div>I'm not sure exactly which service, or combination of services being changed fromn automatic to manual is causing this, but it's definitely being caused by making changes in this area. To figure this out, I'm going to have to "Ghost" after I make each one, because once the fatal change is made, resetting back to defaults does not work. This will take a very long time and each Ghost Image uses quite a bit of HD space. I do have a 200G drive here and I may just do this for posterity's sake. It's just one of those things that could save some poor schmuck like me a lot of grief.
