It worked right out of the box with no hassle for me, first on a pc/xp, then my mac pro running win xp.

I bought Mike's drivers and used those on the mac, since it's multicore, but there were no irq's that needed to be set in windows, etc. Virtually painless.

I got the expansion kit and put it in my own rackmount atx case, with a big silent fan and 500w power supply. It's much quieter than my experience with the magmas I've had, but of course I guess you could always swap fans in those also.
