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FWIW, I get clicks and dropouts with some combinations of plugins. I don't own an IUD, but it seems that Waves plugins in conjunction with PSP, (VintageWarmer... which I like a lot), or Amplitube can cause the dropouts.

Usually flushing the memory (by way of saving and reboot), fixes it. I have started rendering tracks with lots of edits to avoid this. (minus plugins so I can tweak as I build the mix.)

I'm thinking that this problem is more related to screwy memory allocation as one builds a complex mix, (and applies more plugins), and is probably responsible

for the persistence of the occasional Crash-on-exit, and unhandled exception, rather than the IUD plugins themselves.

Having said that, I reiterate that I don't own one, so WTF do I know?? I'm just relating that I have had the exact same symptoms.

Oh, and I'm using a NF3 K8NS-ULTRA 939.
