I need Paris to be able to recognize 2 x ADAT cards per MEC so I have been running Paris on Win ME using an ASUS A7V8X-LAN mobo for almost 3 years. Very stable. The largest CPU this mobo will accommodate is the AMD XP 3200 and it's got a 333MHz system bus as compared to the 400MHz system bus of more current systems so in that respect, it's a bit of a dinosaur. However, I have had over 35 VST plugins of varying types installed on a project just to see what it could survive. My CPU is an XP 2800. It held up well under this load. IIRC, it was using 60-70% CPU.
