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System restore was made for XP, however, microsoft later released updates for 2000, ME, 98, etc. You would have had to update your 98 OS to get it. It would reside in your Program/Accessories/System Tools menu.

I would just try to get your EDS plugin folder, and your VST folder restored as closely as possible, and then see what happens.
