It's my eventual goal to collect as many PARIS resources as possible into one location for my own lazy sake. To that end, I'm scavenging and organizing as much of the existing PARIS practical-knowledge-base as I can find on the internet into an additional website, which I'll put up and link from the blog as time permits. I will very much appreciate your suggestions and input on this.
