IMO Logic 8 is a big step up from Logic 7 in terms of work flow without killing the power behind Logic. They obviously put some thought into it. The newly included Mainstage is pretty cool, too, as is Waveburner. (The

bundling of Soundtrack Pro didn't add anything for me since it's also included with Final Cut.)

There have been two Logic/Waveburner/Mainstage releases in the last four months. Hopefully they will continue the development pace and increase the stability for anyone having problems. From the Logic team's past development performance, that's a reasonable expectation. Especially since any wobbliness is entirely on Apple, they make the computer, the OS and the app. Not much finger pointing can be done to excuse any problems. :^)

This last Logic release included a couple of specific features users have been requesting, so it's encouraging that the developers seem to be listening to the users.

We aren't going down that road - well Rick can if he wants. ;-)

I'm not holding any hopes for Vista for pro audio. Most PC audio users I know are sticking to XP (which of course can't last forever). Leopard does in fact look like a nice upgrade. The last I heard from Nuendo/Mac users is that the latest rev of Leopard actually improved low latency performance -

not sure exactly how much actual performance it would translate to for most users, but it sounded promising for Mac users, or anyone considering a Mac for audio. Since I'll be moving my East West

libraries to Play next year (when Symph. Orch is released), and it's been updated for better 64 bit support than most apps,

a Mac with 8-16G of Ram is a distinct possibility for me - that's why I keep an eye on threads like this to get an idea of what's

happening in the real world - the one not influenced by the ads and hype.

Apple holding the reigns of core audio bothers me a little, but it's really no worse than Microsoft holding the reigns of whether an application can actually function under its' OS. Apple is strong with Final Cut, so I'm not any more worried about their committment to audio than I am about Digi pirating the native realm to put everyone else out of business (okay, that last part is more of a concern at the moment).

As far as actual speed for audio, XP appears to be a little faster than either Leopard or Vista. May not be enough to matter to most, but in terms of the Apple ads, well, marketing by most companies is just an attempt to convince buyers of their version of the truth, regardless of the actual facts. :-) That said, Vista and Leopard are more extensive OSs than XP, so a little droop in higher demand performance tests is to be expected.

Found out something interesting when looking at Leopard at CompUSA last week - Spaces does eat RAM for every instance - it's a cool idea, but for all but average users, it's just like loading multiple apps - just cleaner (which would be great for my wife who likes to keep 10 apps open on a Mac with only 768M of RAM....sigh.... probably one reason the poor beast is headed out to pasture).
