I've been trying to help out a friend whose using Cubase SE on a Mac (iBook G4, osx 10.4.10 1ghz power pc, 640mb of ram). On playback, after recording only one track, the track has clicks and pops about every six to seven seconds. Buffers were set at: 4 buffers each at 128kb. She tried different mics as well as different cables -still pops and crackles. She's using a Maudio Fast track interface -latest drivers. This interface is USB.

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Well, I'd hate to think that just one track would cause buffer issues, but just to eliminate that as a possibility you should try setting your buffers to progressively higher settings & see if it goes away at some stage.

-m-audio fast track ..Look, M-audio makes some of the best Windows drivers..Can't say that about it's Mac driver support

Solution: Sell the iMac, and get a Mac Book pro..NOT a Mac Book, but the Mac Book Pro...2) Use either a Motu or RME interface.. They both have the best driver support for the Mac platform..
