However in the native insert I get a listing for the vst plugins I have.

Have uninstalled the software and reinstalled and reseated the eds1000 card, still the same thing.  
Am I missing something or could the eds1000 card be bad?

Graphical interface, password options, single button OS selection, and it's FREE. ;o) It just wont reallocate drive names on the second drive...
