There was so much noise getting into the preamps from the computer, it was unuseable.

The dealer didn't have any more in stock so they gave me the rack version instead...and I was really happy.

I now use the M-Audio Mix Control firewire unit so the 1010 is relegated to emergencies.

One thing to be aware of though... you can get direct monitoring only on the first two channels... not sure if that's a problem for you or not. It would only become an issue when overdubbing more than two tracks at a time. Other than that, they work great.
