>Rode NTV-\$450.00 - This is the cardioid LCD that some folks just love and is becoming a bit of a collectors item. Very "tubey/vibey" and 3D sounding with a wankin' big transformer. This is one of those really ballsy, "built like a brick shithouse" mics that Rode made many years ago, right after the came out with the original Classic. They could not sell at a price point (\$1000.00) to compete with the Studio Projects mics. They cheaped out on the successor NTK. I have tried them side by side. The NTK is wimpy and thin sounding/colorless by comparison. There is nothing wimpy and thin sounding about this mic. Very big and "in your face" kinda sound. Reminds me a bit of
