Better? Subjective call...but for what I am wanting to hear, the Fairchild usually gets it done. To my ears, it is much smoother and responsive to nuance than the LA2 (which, just so you know, neither are really that close to the originals...I've heard a well maintained Fairchild in a studio, and it is as close to a sonic orgasm as I've heard - but they cost \$30,000 plus an additional \$5K to maintain each year.)

I use the 1176 pretty much as a flavor enhancer and limiter, running drum submixes on the 1st button (4 db), attack time at 9 release at about 2-3...some people like the "all buttons" setting - not my cup of coffee...
