It appears to be primarily a controller for VSTi's but I want to use it as a plugin controller as my outdated Steiny Houston is buggy as hell with UAD-1 plugs and often crashes the system so I am reduced to mousing. The literature on this KORE thingy indicates that it can be used to tweak parameters on VST plugins but I doubt if it will work the way *I* want it to because forum members are reporting that it doesn't have PDC for DSP based plugins like UAD-/POCO. However, methinks they may be trying to implement it as an audio interface as well so this may (possibly-as in 1000 mile long shot) be part of the problem though I doubt it.....plus, NI is saying that they are trying to correct this PDC oversight so we'll see.

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The info on the user's forum looks pretty grim, but user's forums are sometimes more about troubles than success stories. After reading a bit

more, I determined that setting the KORE driver latency (yikes.....another ****in driver to configure) to a minimum and inserting the KORE as a VST plugin in the first insert or send slot in a Cubase SX 3x project seems to be working for some folks. There's a whole 'nuther can of worms involved with this critter as far as producing clicks and pops too and I just spent 6 months sussing this issue with 4 x UAD-1's and 3 x RME cards by resorting to using 2 x Magma chassis' in one DAW. If this thing starts overloading my PCI bus, it's gonna get shitcanned PDQ and I will once again be reduced to mousing

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I'm sorta' at the point right now with my native DAW that I reached with my

Paris DAW a couple of years ago.....finding the sweet spot so that it does everything I need, at least withiun the contest of using Paris for tracking and both DAWs for mixing. The logical next step will be a move to 64 bit and all that goes with it. At this point I may start looking at the monster Intel Macs or quad socket dual core AMD machines. I just have this feeling tat when 64 bit comes along, these mosterr boxes are going to be able to compete with Paris as far as "near zero" latency goes and that 64 bit will enable developers to come up with more realistic sounding mix bus coding, sort of like the 56 point Paris mix bus. It looks like WWIII is about to begin so I'm not goping to speculate too much on what's going to happen in the next 12 months, but if the world is still somewhat recognizable, "possibly" systems like this may be justifiable/affordable. The Apogee interfaces for the Mac look like a very nice situation for a powerful turnkey DAW.
