source code folder.

They then modified the code to make it what we saw in the dp/pro. In the case of the halls, there massive changes. The Pro version is wider and more transparent. But, they also removed the chorusing in the pro version, which gives the dp/4 version slightly nicer last split seconds of tail.

The dp/4 versions sound incredibly nice. The DP4 ran at 16 bit, 40.5 KHz. Those same algos at 44.1 with 24 bit stereo inputs sound really nice.
