A, that's the same thing I was doing with Paris & Logic together on the same machine when I first got Paris; in order to be able to use Logic's MIDI feature to playback/trigger my programmed synth parts & record them into Paris (v2).

I don't recall the exact procedure, but you had to have various settings on each app set "just so", and then Paris HAD to be the slave (contrary to what the manual says, in that Paris works better as the master app).
