The Nvidia 8400 and 8500 chipset PCI-e cards will work great.

If you can still find them the "older" 7300GT based video cards will work great but are getting tough to come by.

Try to avoid cards that are over 256 megs of if you are using UAD cards they will tend to have compatibility issues.

Look for XFX, ASUS and Gigabyte 8400, 8500 and 8600 series card. You can even find fan less versions of some of these.
