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I've heard that rumor too. Considering Apple's isolationistic approach, I wouldn't be surprised. Add to that the recent news from Apogee about Symphony, it's integration with Logic, and it being Mac only, there seems to be a power play in the Apple camp for the Mac DAW market, and Digi doesn't seem to have been invited to the party. MOTU and DP may be next to re-evaluate, but DP has a lot more to lose since it has no history or basis on the PC.

I'm not a ProTools fan and might recommend other options for other reasons, but in all fairness I don't know if I would write it out of your plans on this rumor alone - just research carefully, and consider the cost of moving it to a PC if the rumors become fact.

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The first time I heard this was, oh, 1998 or so when it looked like Apple was going under. It was an especially hollow threat then since their PC software was abysmal. Today, with a hardware partner like M-Audio who knows how to write Windows drivers and a reasonable presence on the Windows platform the threat is much less hollow.

Also keep in mind that Avid has their own axe to grind with Apple and FCP. These conflicts on interest are part of what's good and bad about being both an application and system software vendor (and in this case a hardware vendor to boot).

That said, it sure wouldn't *hurt* Digi when they sit down at the bargaining table to have the rumor out there that they were considering moving their entire user base to Vista machines, would it? I would guess it's probably in Digi's self interest to simultaneously hold on to it's base of Mac users while keeping these kind or rumors percolating about at every NAMM show.

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Rumor has it that big things are in fact happening between Steinberg and Yamaha - just nothing public yet, but I think it's on the way in the not too distant future.

One guess: Nuendo is being designed to be a central studio/control hub for large post and music production facilities. This will be even more integrated with Yamaha consoles, and other products (softsynth versions of Yamaha synths?), and probably a future controller or two, or three. VST 3.0 is on the way and will probably enhance that capability with (my guess) possibly a hybrid of mLan and VST system link -i.e. Not just file control/check in/check out and project management, but audio/FX/midi streaming over Gigabit and firewire LANs, and WANs. Add to that a global network somewhat like Rocket net, but one that may actually survive in creating a wider collaborative approach to music.
