A couple people said they couldn't hear a difference from the hardware (on the same preset), others saying the opposite, etc. Casey from Bricasti had to kind of chime in and say basically, c'mon, they are not the same thing as the hardware. Just kind of a wierd position for him to be in, since he gave them permission to release them if they were free..

I'm sure the impulses will be good enough for some people who were maybe planning on buying the hardware to hold off. It will be interesting to see if Acousticas will be given permission to sample V2 when it comes out sometime in coming months..

I hear what you're saying, but I still like using my outboard. Your work always sounds great anyway so it probably doesn't matter as much to you, but I honestly need all the help I can get . In the case of the Bricasti, there's 4 quick "favorite settings" recall buttons on the front, and I find it honestly as hassle free as any reverb plugin to use in a mix and do recall later. Software implementation like the PCM 96 would be great, but that probably won't happen for the M7. I'm been writing music this past week for a tv show, and am mixing tonight, and I'd hate to do it without my M7.. it's just really great at creating natural space around things..
