Good questions: (2) Eide slots...4(sata 3.0) slots, even buit-in firewire which is nice.

However, continue to follow the PCI rules that we've always followed with EDS cards. All Slots will work if you have 4 cards, but you should disable a few of the usb2 ports..

Plenty of room for the EDS cards and it does interfere with the IDE ribbon cable(s)..
