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The Drumagog plug-in will go in your normal VST Plug-In folder you have PARIS pointing to. I installed the GOG sound files on an external Firewire drive the I use for sample storage. It will probably be ok to put the GOG files on any hard drive, but it would be best to put them on a drive other than your boot drive or recording drive. Once you open Drumagog, you'll need to "point" to or "set the path" to the GOG sound files.

None of what I have read on this forum regarding installing the drumagog plugin. So I called the guy who created the program. Unique name, Rem..... Anyhow I will post what he had me do because it was the only thing that worked.

You don't have a folder in Paris that is called VSTPlugins. That is and has always been everyones big holdup! You have to Create a folder on the Hard drive and Label it (and with NO GAPS)

VSTPlugins. (no .) Then when you hit the installer and let it do the "Easy Install" it will look for THAT folder that you created.

This is what creates the plugin. Then you drag that plugin into the plugins folder that is in the Ensoniq folder that is in the System folder in your Hard Drive.
