I'd say a rack strip and two pieces of velcro would do the trick. Not pretty but you didn't ask for that.

As an alternative I'd think about a laptop. I'm keeping quiet about it because I'm still stress testing, but I just set up a \$500 (yes, \$500) laptop with an RME cardbus card that is doing astonishing things. You might be able to record with laptop + RME cardbus/firewire and then fly the tracks over to PARIS via lightpipe.

I know this isn't not the best place to be saying this, but native is looking really impressive these days. I bought the \$500 laptop on the theory that

I could take it out live and not care too much if I broke it. This was after watching my work laptop fall off a stand while on stage, with me wondering if I had backups of my perl code or not. But this crappy little machine is something else. Again, I'll stress test it and see what I can find out, but think about that as an option.
