It was every bit as good as anything getting radio airplay in 1964.

I wish I could be in Ft. Worth right now. All my old musician buddies are there today at the funeral and they've been sending me e-mails. I send one of them an MP3 of one of Macle's tunes. They loved it. That's the genre we were all into back then and still love. It's great to see that there are folks who are still influenced by these beautiful melodic Lennon/MaCartney/George Martin'esque songwriting/ production ideas, are keeping them alive and taking them to a new level.
