I recently spec'd a VO system for a friend in the western part of the state in a similar situation - looking for good quality but not overkill - I'm going with the TC Konnekt 8 for him as it's pres have gotten great reviews (haven't heard it yet, so take that for what its' worth - in that price range it probably is the best of the bunch).

For a mic, the Blue Bluebird is a great mic for VO - nice even, clear response across the board - smooth highs too which isn't common in sub-\$1k mics.

The AT3035 is pretty good as well, and a little less than the Bluebird - and imho, better than the C1, or at least comparing in that price range.

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If you can route it so that the channel signal through the sequencer is muted but the reverb return is not, meanwhile monitoring the direct signal from the i/o box, then any latency in the sequencer would just act as predelay to the verb.
