There are also lots of things to port over from Steve or John's sites - so even folks who don't reckon they have much to say have every bit as good a shot at winning cool free plugs. The only things I'd have to rule out are copyrighted material (such as scanning the manual) or material not relevant to PARIS (and assume Mike and I are disqualified from the competition)

I'll post a clear, easy-to-use primer outlining the process for editing the Wiki shortly (it's really a snap, you just double click on the page and type).
