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The entire 700 MHz band is up for sale. This affects all the wireless manufacturers. Shure has been lobbying quite heavily to prevent this. Even Broadway and Hollywood have gotten into the act. The pro audio industry is so tiny, that it doesn't have the clout to do anything about it. Companies like Verizon (currently a huge problem for RF mics) will probably buy the band. Sennheiser has recently announced that they will only make 700MHz range wireless now by special order. That means they are losing their "C" and "D" wireless ranges.
