Haven't cut the vocal OD's yet. That's just the scratch track.....a '58
into a Demeter HM-1 preamp with drum kit bleed all over it. I processed it
with a UAD-1 Neve 88RS channel strip and dialed up all the air I could
before it started screaming for mercy. Not sure what we're going to use for
the vocal path yet. I just snagged a Millennia Origin SST-1 over on the 3dB
forum. It will be here next Thursday. I used one years ago when the first
came out with my SPA U87 and it was a sweet combo on femme vocal with the
tube preamp circuit and transformer switched into the signal path. Dubs are
a week from Sunday so I think that will be on the menu. Also, the Peluso
2247, or SE Gemini paired with the Focusrite RED7 is turning out to be a
nice sounding signal path on sources with fast transients. The RED has a

fast VCA circuit, but it's not a "life sucker" and the tubularity of those mics plays nice with the solid state preamp circuit. The Forssell CS-1 sounds good with just about any mic (seriously). The other day I tried it with a Manley Baby Blue and it was a "holysht" moment.....so we'll probably check that out too, though it's a bit of an aggressive sounding mic. I used a stereo pair of the Manleys on the drum OH's for this session.. Wouldn't surprise me though if we dust off the '58 again and just use it. Nothin wrong with a '58 and a Mackie, IMO. If it works, it works.
