Hi Mike,
Yep know about the boot.ini setting but it basically negates a reason to even have a dual core at all.
Most all of Paris issues with multi- cpu setups comes from the hard ware driver level.
Have you tried the method of setting affinity for individual hardware devices? Some of the newer Intel core2 duo based motherboards actually let you switch the cpu to to a single core mode in the bios with out having to mess with the boot.ini end of things.
As long as you install widows with the dual core enabled you can then switch back and forth with out any adverse effects.
