I have searched the net many times and, to my knowledge, I'm the only person in the universe that is trying to use the particular hardware combination I've got here. I could be wrong though......I just haven't yet run across anyone trying to use 3 RME PCI cards and 4 x UAD-1 cards. There are some major *issues* with PCI overload and lots of configuration hoops to jump through to get this to happen without crackling in the audio when UAD resources exceed 40%..

I think my troubles have to do with using 3 x RME HDSP PCI cards instead of using a MADI system and being hard headed enough to not want to......MADI would not really give me the combination of I/O that I want.

2 x HDSP 9652's and a Multiface is *exactly* the ticket to interface with my Paris system, 6 MEC modules and all of the AES and SPDIF gear I have here. There is a definite reason I'm putting myself through this grief, plus, since it is sooo friggin tricky to get this particular situation to work, I seem to get a perverse pleasure out of trying to bend it to my will. ;0)
