Hi all. On a different topic - Reaper developer 404NotFound has just released a beta of his OMF support extension.

Users of various other DAWs are generating OMF files right now to test it out. So I was thinking if anyone wants the ability to transfer sessions from PARIS to Reaper via OMF (just as an interim measure until we figure out how to open our .ppjs directly in Reaper) then this would be an *excellent* time to create some OMF files from PARIS sessions, and test importing them into Reaper via the extension.

I'm half way through setting up my PARIS rig and won't be able to tackle this for a few days myself - but you know what a flaky POS OMF support can be; here's a chance to work straight with a developer virtually in realtime to make certain it's rock solid using actual PARIS-generated OMFs. We can make ours work as solidly as anyone else's.
