have my doubts if DSD will make them sound better.

The Midi sequencing in Pyramix is far less than that of PT even so for
most Composers I know of I don't think it will be adequate. Running a
second machine for VSTi then you are at the mercy of this "horrible"
sounding wave file format anyways.

If you were recording the live performance of your orchestral
arrangement done using DSD will possibly make a difference.

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Hi James,

There stuff has been selling some what in Europe but has always been a tough sell here in the US. It also tends to be targeted to a very niche market. As if high end pro audio isn't a small enough niche!!

Like Pro Tools as long as you don't use any RTAS or (VST in Pyramix's

case) and just use the hardware based DSP then there is no latency. When you use any native effects then you will introduce latency of some form.

Fast hard drives are whats giving em that track count. Probably doing some caching or buffing on there card like Sydec did on the Red system.
