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Chris,

What I usually do is to unload the HD from the external box, hang it on an IDE cable, set it master or slave (whatever is appropriate), then use a boot disk to FDISK it. Once that is done, I create a new partition (s), then power down the machine. I then reboot to the boot disk and format. It works *every* time.

I'm a FAT 32 guy though. If you're using NTFS, then this isn't going to help.

This'll work for XP and booting into the OS as well. Take the HDD out of the case, add to the IDE system. Set jumper to slave, master or cable select as appropriate. Boot, noting in the BIOS if it sees the drive or no. Go on into windows, right click on the My Computer icon and go to manage. Go to Disk Management. From here you can format, assign a letter, whatever you need to do. I would not assign a letter fwiw, as you will be moving the drive back to the USB case anyway. Format away.
